Lincoln County School District #2 has a "Gearing Up for Kindergarten" program that is funded by our 21st Century Community Learning Centers Cohort 9 Grant, and we want to make sure all children have an opportunity to attend preschool.

We are grateful to our **21CCLC Grant** for also funding these other programs at Afton, Thayne, Etna, and Osmond Elementary Schools: **Morning Fitness, STEM classes in Dry Creek Academy and Etna Enrichment Express, Swim-N-Learn, Mastery Camp, and GOFASA**. Morning fitness is offered at our elementary schools for as many students as are able to attend because studies have proven that aerobic exercise leads to better brain functioning. This is explained in the book, <u>Spark: The Revolutionary New Science of Exercise and the Brain,</u> by John J. Ratey, MD. We are excited to be able to give some of our students the opportunity to get their heart rate up during that extra time they have before school begins. We would like to encourage all students to participate in physical fitness activities before and after school to help improve academic achievement.

Pumpkin Decorating Contest: Please NO CARVING! Decorate, Paint, Sticker your pumpkin at home. Put your name and teacher's name on the back. The bottom of the pumpkin can be no larger than an 8 ½ X 11 sheet of paper. Parents can bring the finished pumpkins to school beginning the morning of <u>Monday, October 23rd.</u> <u>PUMPKINS ARE</u> <u>NOT ALLOWED ON THE BUS, either coming to or going from school!</u> Pumpkins should be placed outside each classroom above the student's cubby. The pumpkins will be judged on Oct. 31st. The PTO will be giving recognition to students who bring pumpkins for the contest. Parents may take their child's pumpkin home after the costume parade on October 31st. Remember: PUMPKINS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE BUS! (Any remaining Pumpkins will be disposed of.)

Halloween Costume Parade: The parade will be on Tuesday, October 31st at 2:00 p.m. Please keep in mind that the district dress code applies to the costumes worn to school. Parents, please make sure that any costume worn by you is also dress code appropriate and in keeping with school standards. Watch for any other costume instructions from your student's teacher. Remember that students should NOT wear masks or bring weapons with their costumes. Extremes in the nature of "wounds" or "bloody and gory" appearances are not in keeping with appropriate wear for grade school. If you plan on taking your child home with you after the parade, your student must have a written note, so the teacher knows you will be taking them.
