We work hard and invest significant time in training and collaboration with staff, law enforcement and medical agencies, as well as experts in the field of safety and security to utilize effective, research-based strategies to ensure the safety and well-being of our students and staff.

PREVENTION

• Law Enforcement Presence

• Our School Resource Officer visits our campus regularly. Other town and county officers also visit our campus. We are grateful for our partnership with such caring and diligent officers.

• Physical Facility

- State of the art security cameras with views on all entrances, hallways, and school grounds
- Access to cameras from multiple devices throughout the building
- o "Lockdown" buttons immediately locks all exterior doors
- Card reader access locks
- Intercom system Allows all staff members to initiate any of the 5 emergency SRP actions from anywhere in the building
- o Staff radios enable efficient communication
- Office radio directly connects our school to dispatch, district administrators, and other local agencies

• Visitor Management System

• All visitors must scan their ID, allowing the Raptor system to conduct a background check. Upon completion, an ID badge is printed, and the visitor must wear the badge indicating who they are, the purpose of their visit and the area of the building they have been permitted to enter.

• ID Badges Required

- All staff are required to wear an ID badge
 All visitors required to obtain visitor badge after gaining clearance to enter building

IDENTIFICATION & INTERVENTION

- Safe-To-Tell
 - Anonymous tip line reporting system that shares information with local law enforcement and campus administration



- Counseling
 - Mrs. Leeper, Thayne Elementary School Psychologist, works with administration, staff, and other district psychologists to allocate resources to provide counseling for students with mental health needs

CRISIS RESPONSE

• School Safety Committee

- o Members include administration, staff, parents, and students
- Principles of safety include:
 - Care
 - Efficiency
 - Assimilation
 - Confidence
- The committee meets regularly to establish and maintain safety protocols
